



Class Environmental Assessment
Glencoe Area Water Reservoir Replacement
Notice of Public Information Centre No. 2

The existing steel clad concrete water storage standpipe located along Dundonald Road in the Village of Glencoe has reached the end of its useful life and is in need of replacement due to a combination of condition and volume in order to provide pressure and flow to the Municipality. The Municipality of Southwest Middlesex is considering options to replace this treated water storage and has undertaken a study to determine the preferred method of providing water storage within the municipality.

Public input and comment are invited for incorporation into the planning and design of this project and will be received throughout the project. A public consultation will be held on

The Municipality's consultant, The Thompson Rosemount Group will complete a short presentation at 7 pm followed by a Question and Answer Period. Following the presentation, information boards and staff will be available for review and discussion regarding the project.

Subject to comments received and receipt of the necessary approvals, the Municipality of Southwest Middlesex intends to proceed with the planning, design and construction of this project, to be completed by fall 2010.

The project is being planned under Schedule B of the Municipal Class Environmental Assessment.

An updated evaluation of alternatives upon review of land acquisition alternatives has indicated that the preferred alternative is to construct an elevated storage tank with a total storage of 3,600 cubic meters located on municipally owned property on Parkhouse Drive adjacent to Ekcoe Central Public School (east side). This will provide storage and pressure for the 40 year lifespan of the facility allowing for community growth. The estimated cost of the project is \$4.44 million dollars of which 2/3 funding has been secured from the Federal and Provincial Governments through the Building Canada Fund – Communities Component. The remaining 1/3 of the project cost will be paid out of municipal reserves.
