



Class Environmental Assessment
Glencoe Area Water Reservoir Replacement
Notice of Completion

The existing steel clad concrete water storage standpipe located along Dundonald Road in the Village of Glencoe has reached the end of its useful life and is in need of replacement due to a combination of condition and volume in order to provide pressure and flow to the Municipality.

The proposed replacement for the existing standpipe is to construct an elevated storage tank with a total storage of 3,600 cubic metres located on municipally owned property on Parkhouse Drive adjacent to Ekcoe Central Public School (east side). The existing standpipe and associated equipment will be demolished once the new facility is operational. Additional works proposed to upgrade the overall system include Schedule A upgrades to the Booster Station at the intersection of Parkhouse Drive and Thames Road, the Melbourne Standpipe and the in-ground Reservoir in West Lorne. These works are planned to be completed by early 2011 at an estimated cost of \$5.98 million.

The above project is being planned under **Schedule B** of the **Municipal Class Environmental Assessment**. Subject to comments received as a result of this Notice, and the receipt of necessary approvals, the Municipality of Southwest Middlesex intends to proceed with the design and construction of this project.

Interested persons should provide written comment to the municipality on the proposal within 30 calendar days from the date of this Notice. Comment should be directed to the Public Works Manager at the Municipal Office.

If concerns arise regarding this project, which cannot be resolved in discussion with the municipality, a person or party may request that the Minister of the Environment make an order for the project to comply with Part II of the Environmental Assessment Act (referred to as a Part II Order), which addresses individual environmental assessments. Requests must be received by the Minister at the address below within 30 calendar days of this Notice. A copy of the request must also be sent to the Public Works Manager. If there is no "request" received by April 5, 2010, the reservoir replacement and associated works will proceed to design and construction as presented in the planning documentation.
