The restructured municipality of Southwest Middlesex was incorporated on January 1, 2001. This amalgamation joined the Villages of Glencoe and Wardsville and the Townships of Ekfrid and Mosa. The area of land found within our boundaries is 42,960 hectares. We have a large agricultural base along with manufacturing, institutional and retail business activity.

We are a small urban and rural area that boasts full services. The two major urban centres in the Municipality are the communities of Glencoe and Wardsville. We also have four hamlet areas including Appin, Melbourne, Middlemiss and Pratt Siding. Running along our most southern boundary is the historic Thames River, with varied terrain, woodlands and scenic vistas throughout the municipality.

Economic Development

Southwest Middlesex is committed to attracting new businesses, and maintaining the vitality of existing business established in the community by supporting economic development and enhancing the overall quality of life for all citizens.

Southwest Middlesex has an Economic Development Committee (EDC) whose members are appointed by the municipal council. The members assist in supporting the goals of Southwest Middlesex. The Committee aims to promote sound economic development by acting as a liaison between existing business/industry and municipal departments, sharing their knowledge of what it is like to do business in the community, proactively identifying any problems relating to industry and other commercial enterprises, and recommending pro-business policies, programs and projects to council.

The Economic Development Committee meets four times a year at 7 p.m. on the first Thursday of the months of March, June, September and December. Meetings are held at the Southwest Middlesex Municipal Building when possible. Members are welcome to attend through electronic means as well. Planning and Zoning

Our planning department is available to advise on the local planning regulations and on the completeness of planning applications, including communications with applicants and their consulting engineers, planners. Zoning maps and the Official Plan can be viewed on our planning page https://www.southwestmiddlesex.ca/services/planning-services

Appointments can be scheduled with the Planner to review and discuss proposed plans for a business and to assist in the determination of where the business may be permitted within the various zone districts. If the location sought for the business is in a zone in which the use is not permitted, the Planner will recommend that either a zoning amendment or minor variance be applied for through the municipal committee of adjustment.

There are circumstances that may require a variance including changes to building signage, parking areas, and/or ancillary buildings or structures. The planner can work with the business owner to start the application, but the business owner should also seek legal representation and depending on the complexity of the change, obtain the assistance of outside professionals to facilitate the presentation of the application to the committee.

Once it is determined that the use is permitted within a zone, when building a new structure or making major alterations to an existing structure, the structure must also adhere to the specifications of the zone with respect to property lines, heights of structures, location and size of signage, etc. It may be determined that a site plan (or other planning approval) may be required to keep your business plans in compliance with local laws.

If the site proposed for the business requires a subdivision of the property or a site plan, then the application will be required to go to the approval authority. It is recommended that the business owner obtain outside legal counsel and potentially planning and/or engineering professionals to present the application to the committee.

Building

Our building department administers and enforces the provisions of the Ontario Building Code (which sets out building, plumbing, electrical and fire codes), and local bylaws which govern construction activities. The building department is responsible for ensuring all construction work in the community complies with the requirements of the Ontario Building Code. The Code has stringent requirements for construction materials and practices, as well as fire suppression requirements. The building department plays an integral role in keeping our community safe.

It is very important to have a professional architect or engineer review the plans for your business and then incorporate the appropriate construction details in the building you are seeking to occupy.

Getting Permitted - Licenses & Checks Required

Depending on the nature of your business, there are a number of actions required in order to gain approval to operate. Licenses can range from basic operating licenses to very specific permits (such as an environmental permit) depending on your business needs.

The following are common types of local permits and licenses:

Business License - Southwest Middlesex currently does not issue business permits but you may need one from the Federal Government (information can be found at https://www.canada.ca/en/services/business/permits.html) or from the Provincial Government (https://www.ontario.ca/page/ontario-business-registry)

Sign Permit - Southwest Middlesex has standards for signage which can be found in our sign by-law - https://www.southwestmiddlesex.ca/laws/sign-law

Fire Inspection - All businesses require a fire safety inspection prior to opening. Please contact us at 519-287-2015 x8104 to arrange your inspection.

Food Service Regulations - Food sales are primarily regulated through the Middlesex London Health Unit. Please contact the MLHU at 519-663-5317 or visit their website shown below for more information.

Signs, Awnings & Canopies

We always recommend that you look through the Southwest Middlesex sign by-law before ordering new signs, awnings or canopies for your business. There are some signs that require a permit before they are allowed to be erected and some that must also require public review before proceeding.

Most times it is just a matter of ensuring that the placement of signage complies with the local regulations so it is always worth having a conversation with staff before proceeding with purchasing signs for your business.
