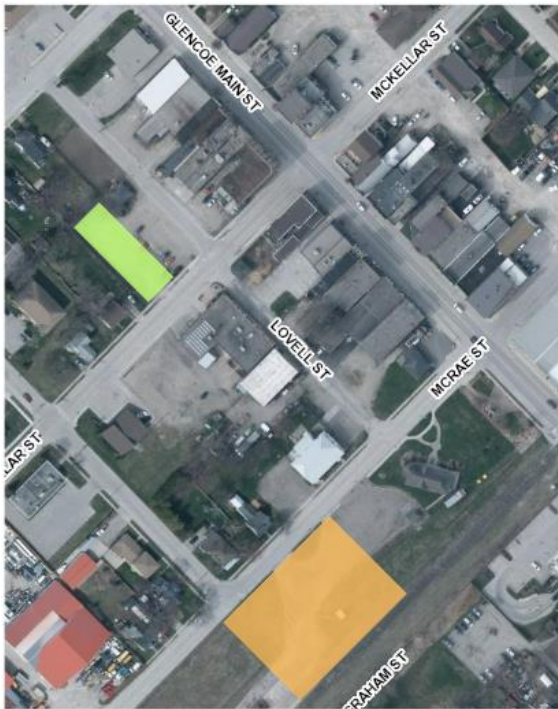
Business owners, employees, and tenant visitors are kindly asked to avoid using Main Street spaces for all-day parking or personal vehicles, especially in front of other businesses. These prime spots are best reserved for customers stopping to shop or do business downtown. Leaving spaces open for shoppers improves customer access and supports the vitality of downtown Glencoe.

Free Public Parking Lots

For longer visits or employee parking, there are two free and convenient lots available off Main Street:

- **Train Station Lot** – plenty of space and a short walk to Main Street
- **Gravel Lot** – across from the Municipal Office (McKellar & Lovell Streets)

These lots are close, easy to access, and free to use. Choosing them helps keep Main Street parking open for shoppers.

Winter Parking Restrictions – Advance Notice

As a reminder, overnight parking is not permitted on Main Street, Glencoe, year-round.

From November 1st to May 1st, parking is not allowed on any municipal roads between 3:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. This by-law helps snowplows and winter maintenance crews clear the roads safely and efficiently. Parking restrictions are monitored, and tickets may be issued for infractions.
