- 1) 2018 Aquatic Staffing to consist of seven full time instructors/guards (including one supervisor and two assistant supervisors) and two-part time instructors/guards.
- Applicants with three or more successive years of experience at our pool will not require an interview unless they are applying for a promotion.
- 3) Early registration to be held on a weeknight in early June with 10% savings offered at this event.
- 4) Opening the pool on Tuesday June 19th.
- 5) Continuing to offer the Swim to Survive program, starting on June 19th.
- 6) Free public swims on the evening of opening day, the afternoon of Canada Day, and the afternoon on the Sunday of Tartan Days.
- The pool will remain open until Friday August 31st, with the final week's schedule for Monday to Friday being shortened to 12:30 to 4:30pm.
- 8) Special needs one-on-one 8-week lessons continuing to be offered.
- 9) The splash pad to remain open until end of day Monday September 3rd.

Option 1
